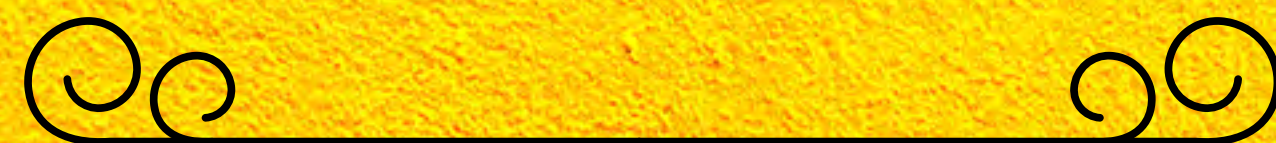

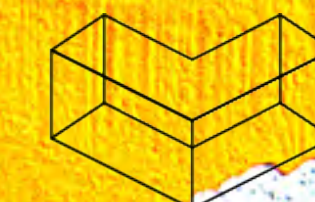




# 1995



In 1995, we had the privilege of hosting what was an **open heaven** over our congregation for a period of **almost 5 months.**

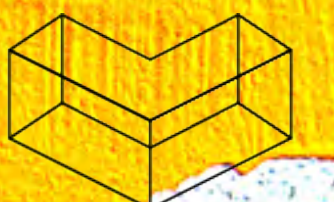

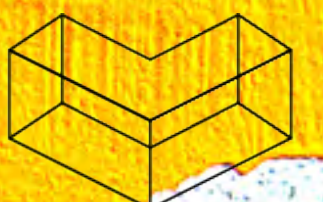

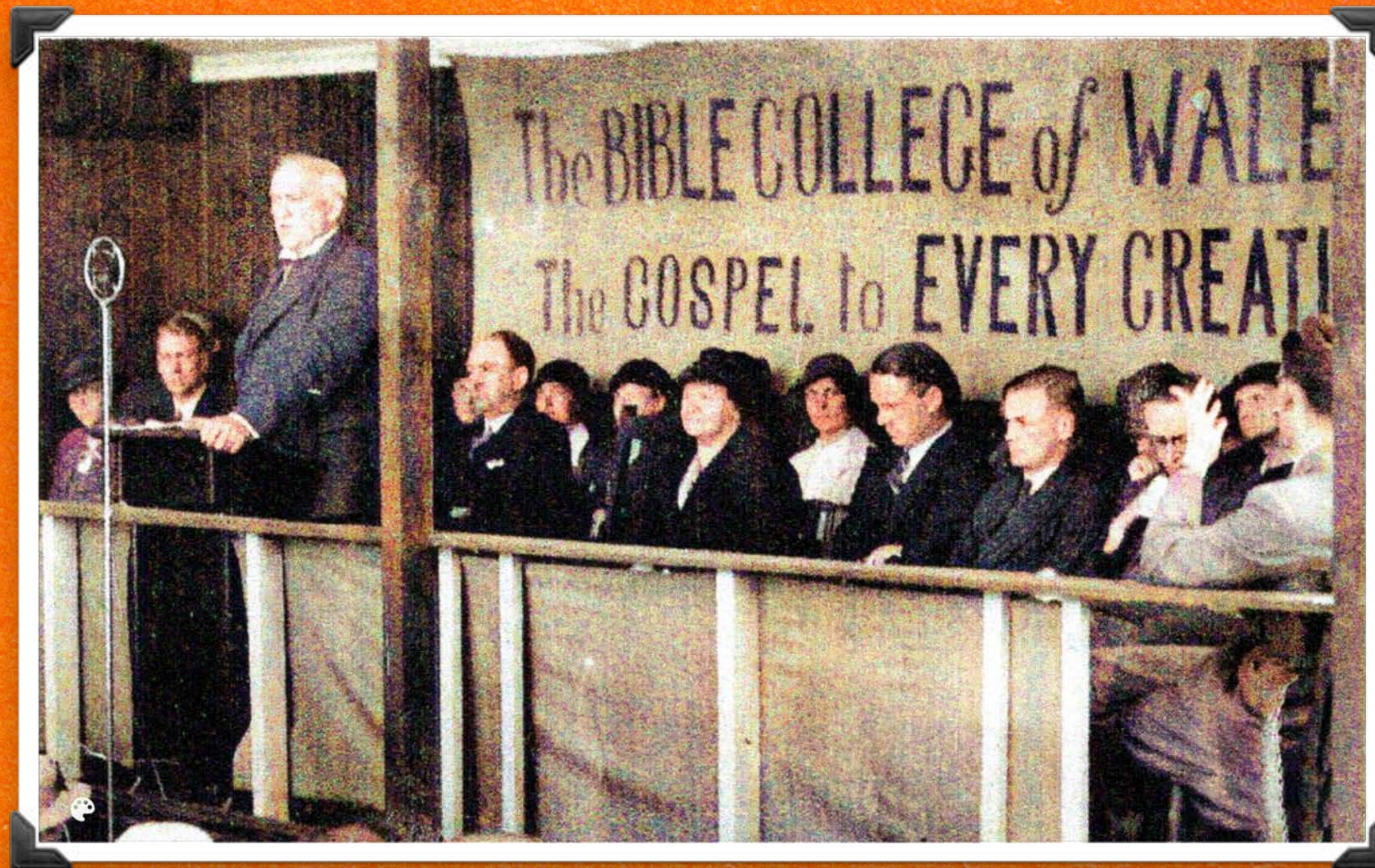

# TWO THINGS THAT RESULTED IN THE WELSH METHODIST REVIVAL



- 1) It created a new denomination – the Calvinistic Methodist Church, which in term of numbers, was the most influential church in Wales.
- 2) It gave Wales its hymns.

Humphrey Jones and David Morgan

**Christian schools and colleges.**



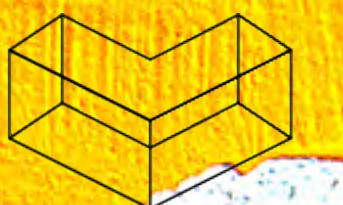

In 1902, home prayer circles started forming throughout Wales and thousands upon thousands joined together with one intention, to pray for **world-wide revival**.

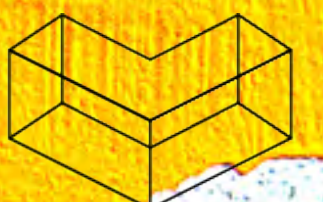

By 1903, many pastors were preaching the necessity of the Cross, which essentially is the **message of Calvary.**

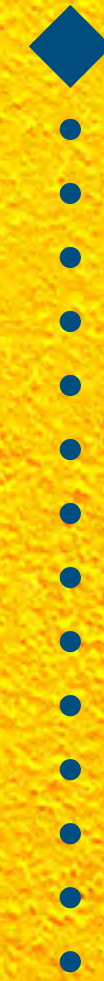

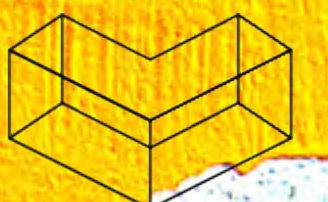




# 1904
