

The first 3 Gospels recorded mainly **what** Jesus did.

John focused on Who Jesus is.





Miracles (Signs) Highlighted in John:

- 2. Christ Heals the Nobleman's Son ---- JOHN 4
- 3. Christ Heals the Paralytic Man ---- JOHN 5
- 4. Christ Feeds the Five Thousand ---- JOHN 6
- 5. Christ Walks on Water ---- JOHN 6
- 6. Christ Heals the Man Born Blind ---- JOHN 9
- 7. Christ Raises Lazarus From the Dead ---- JOHN 11





On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. ² Now both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding. ³ And when they ran out of wine, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine."

Every miracle begins with a problem.





JOHN 2:4-5

Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does your concern have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come." ⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Whatever He says to you, do it."





2 things to note

- 1. Jesus wasn't rude to His mother.
- 2. Shift in authority.





1. God can use ANYTHING.

Now there were set there **six waterpots** of stone, according to the manner of <u>purification</u> of the Jews, containing twenty or thirty gallons apiece.

JOHN 2:6





2. God can use ANYONE who is Available.

Jesus said to them (servants), "Fill the waterpots with water." And they *filled them* up to the brim. 8 And He said to them, "Draw some out now, and take it to the master of the feast." And they *took it*.

JOHN 2:7-8





There are no menial tasks.

Only menial attitude.





3. God of ACCELERATION and ABUNDANCE

When the master of the feast had tasted the <u>water that</u> was made wine, and did not know where it came from (but the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom.

JOHN 2:9





- 3. God of ACCELERATION and ABUNDANCE
 - Jesus accelerated the process of nature.
 - Jesus defied nature.
 - Jesus provided in abundance.





The Miracle & Sign

Why a Wedding Setting?

- 1. Jesus is coming back as the Bridegroom for His Bride, the Church.
- 2. The Bridegroom's responsibility to **provide** wine at the wedding.

Why the Wine?

- 1. Wine is a sign of God's blessings.
- Wine is the New Covenant in His Blood (Holy Communion).
- 3. Wine signifies the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.





4. God always provides the **BEST**.

"A host always serves the best wine first," He said. "Then, when everyone has had a lot to drink, he brings out the less expensive wine. But you have kept the best until now!" ¹¹ This miraculous sign at Cana in Galilee was the first time Jesus revealed His glory. And His disciples believed in Him.
