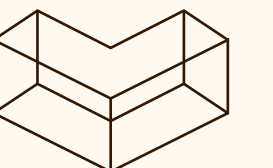
GALATIANS 6:4 (TLB)

⁴ Let everyone be sure that he is doing his very best, for then he will have the personal satisfaction of work well done and won't need to compare himself with someone else.



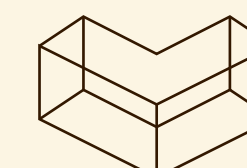
GALATIANS 6:4-5 (NCV)

Pride says:

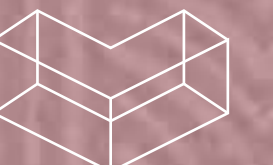
I deserve more.

Pride says:

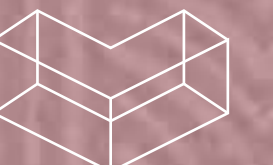
We were going to build a bigger one!
